MARRICKVILLE High School was filled with poetry recently as students teamed up with a contemporary street poet for The Red Room Company's Poetry Education Program.

More than 70 students from Years 9 and 10 participated in the three-day intensive workshop with poet Candy Royalle.

The workshop was designed to challenge ideas about poetry, explore concepts, play with words and get involved in the creative writing process and it was the third year the school participated in the program.

Librarian and workshop facilitator Angela Rega said the program offered students a form of self-expression.

"Many students resist traditional poetry. The Red Room allows them to experience the energy of a working poet firsthand," she said.

"Our students produced collage poetry, disappearing blackout poetry, notice poetry and a collaboratively constructed long verse. It is satisfying to watch students engaged and see their writing confidence soar."

Principal Arety Dassaklis said students would launch a poetry anthology of the best works produced from the program next term.
