

Art & Dementia Programs, NSW, 2015 Red Room Education, with Candy Royalle

In a special collaboration with Sculpture by the Sea, The Red Room Company hosted a series of poetic tours through Sculpture by the Sea's Mark's Park, Tamarama venue. We were joined by Fort Street High School, Barker College Junior, and members of the Art & Dementia Program Led by acclaimed poet Candy Royalle, the workshops used a series of quick response frameworks and activities, prompting personal student responses to the sculptures and their gorgeous sea side setting.

The piece of perception

- A group poem by participants from Yaralla House with poet Candy Royalle in response to Oushi Zokei a sculpture by Keizo Ushio, Sculpture This year, in partnership with Sculpture by the Sea, Bondi we piloted a Tactile Tour with six people with early-onset dementia from Yaralla House, Concord Repatriation Hospital. The session included a partnership with poet Candy Royalle who worked with the participants to create a poem in situ, using the words they related in response to one sculpture.

The participants collaboratively worked to to create a poem was an enjoyable experience as was hearing the poet recite the poem - from observing the facial responses it was clear that participants were delighted when they recognised their words and comments.

The Yaralla House art therapist will use the poem that was completed during the tour as a reflection piece during their reminiscing sessions. The poem will also be displayed in their monthly newsletter along with photos of the day. In addition, they will use photographs of the sculpture that they experienced during the Tactile Tour to develop and create their own sculpture.

Strategies to promote a sense of ease and safety, working together and group confidence included; seating arranged in a semi circle to facilitate inclusive conversation individually and as a group; nametags so all group participants could refer to each other by name. The seating helped in preventing participants from wandering, which is a concern for this organisation. The Tactile Tour and their poetry session gave the participants the opportunity to think creatively and develop their personal responses to the sculpture they encountered through sensory experience. They enjoyed being outside on a beautiful day overlooking the iconic coastline.





Candy Royalle is an award winning performing writing, performance artist, poet, storyteller, activist, educator and vulnerability advocate who fuses cinematic storytelling, poetry and unique vocal rhythms with confronting, political and heart thumping content seeking to break open closed hearts.
